STUDENT ACTIVITY FEE FOR 2006-2007

To help offset the M&O expense of providing extra-curricular student activities in the Tempe Union High School District, a \$25 participation fee will be charged for the activities listed below.

- Activity fees will be charged to participants in all activities and athletics for which a sponsor or coach is paid a stipend for that activity.
- Fees will be \$25.00 per activity with a maximum of \$75.00 for any one student and no family maximum.
- Principals will be responsible to determine if/when financial assistance is needed. Financial Assistance forms may be picked up in the Administration Office at each school.
- Students must pay their activity fee in the bookstore prior to official participation in any activity.
- Refunds can be approved by site administration only.
- Tax credit may be used to pay activity fees. Under state law ARS 4-1089.01, Arizona taxpayers can receive a dollar-for-dollar tax credit when they contribute up to \$200 per year (\$400 for married couples filing a joint return) to extracurricular activities in public schools.
