Dear Student & Parent:

As we enter the second semester, course registration for the 2002/2003 school year begins. Because of the critical nature of high school to continued learning and career preparation, it is very important that parents discuss career direction and course selections with their children. I want to emphasize the importance of taking a full class load through the senior year because of the positive "transition" it creates with college or other post-high school plans. Since we plan our master schedule and hire teachers based on the needs and interests of students, careful reflection and planning is critical to how we staff our school. Please take time to discuss course selections with your student.

We have tried very hard to find a way to implement block scheduling at Mountain Pointe. Our Site Council continues to endorse alternative approaches to our daily schedule that do not require additional funding support from our Governing Board. Our school improvement plan also emphasizes alternative scheduling and staff committees have been organized to continue to study this important need. Thanks to parents and students who have supported alternative scheduling. We appreciate the interest and support of our community.

This spring we will hold a lockdown drill to practice emergency preparedness. Fire drills and lockdowns are held periodically to ensure readiness if the need arises. We want our community to be aware of these activities.

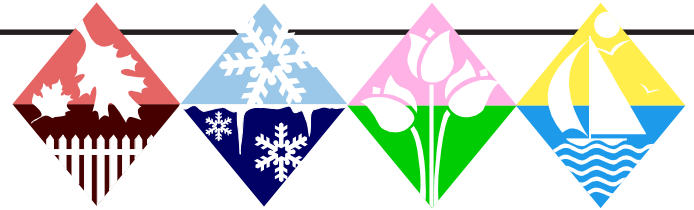
We have installed a new bell system that provides warning music one minute prior to the final bell starting classes. The music, the William Tell Overture, plays briefly as a reminder to avoid being tardy. We are hopeful that this approach will help students to be in class on time--an important value beyond high school.

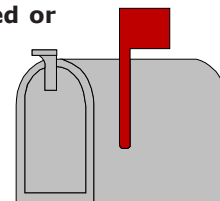

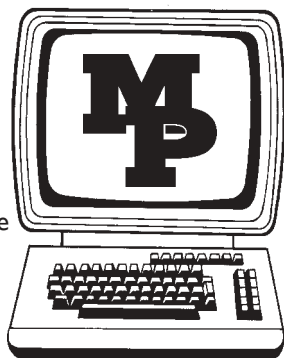

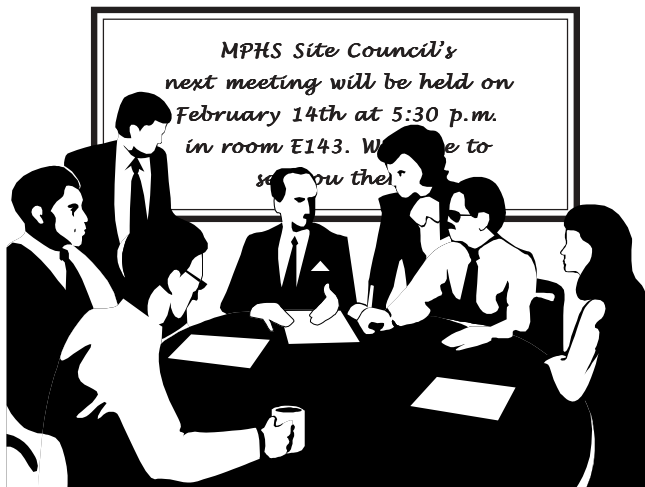

New Program Helps Latinos with Future Educational Goals

Mountain Pointe is excited to announce a new program on campus called ENLACE. The term "ENLACE" comes from the Spanish word "enlazar" which means to link or weave together. ENLACE links local school districts, community colleges, Arizona State University and community based organizations to increase the number of Latinos who graduate from college.

Many Latino students interested in going to college are often the first ones in their families to do so, and therefore have not had a lot of experience with how to plan and prepare for college. An important goal of ENLACE is to give students a sense of what is possible, a positive vision of themselves and a plan for an exciting future. Through the ENLACE partnership Mountain Pointe will help provide resources and information to aid families pursue long-term educational goals.

The ENLACE student selection process focuses on recruiting students who show promise by demonstrating any of the following:

- * Leadership Skills
- * Persistence and determination
- * Goal orientation
- * Motivation for success
- * History for overcoming adversity

It will be the job of the Mountain Pointe staff to nominate 15-20 sophomores who demonstrate the above and would be the first college graduates from their families.

Mountain Pointe is also responsible for providing mentors known as Padrinos and Madrinas. Padrinos/Madrinas can be counselors, teachers, administrators, and classified employees. Each Padrino or Madrina will promote and support a student's educational achievements and service to community. He or she will:

- * Support and listen
- * Be a resource
- * Understand and support
- * Encourage
- * Stimulate the student's desire to serve others

A campus liaison will organize ENLACE activities on our campus and serve as the link between the high school and the ENLACE office. He or she will assist with the following:

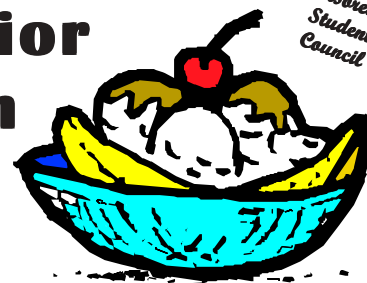
- * Recruit Padrinos and Madrinas.
- * Identify prospective students for ENLACE.
- * Organize and arrange for meetings on campus.

By working in concert with the ENLACE staff and campus liaisons, Madrinas and Padrinos help ENLACE students carry out their educational plans to graduate from high school and ultimately college.

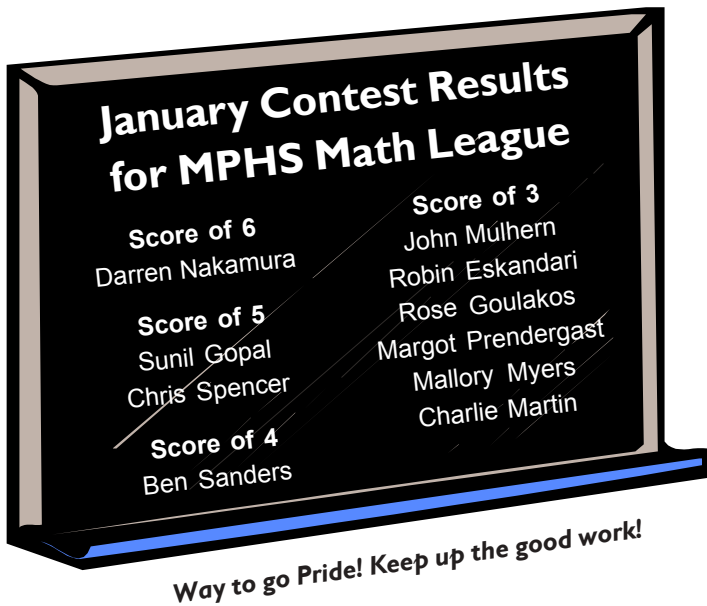

National Honor Society

The goal of the National Honor Society is to provide a unique educational opportunity to the students of Mountain Pointe High School. This project proposes to raise \$4237.50 in order to purchase copies of a book *Touch the Top of the World* by Erik Wiehenmayer as well as to bring Erik to Mountain Pointe to interact with the students. Many high school students, especially freshmen, flounder hopelessly, unaware of the power they have within themselves to shape their own future. Erik Wiehenmayer is a contemporary model for these students. He has overcome blindness to become the first blind person to summit Mount Everest. However, his story is not one of reckless risk taking. Rather, it is replete with examples of his determination and perseverance which allowed him to surpass the expectations of others. His life is one of engendering dignity to self and others and of self-actualization through education and determination. His autobiography enables readers to witness his struggle to accept yet reach beyond and is, therefore, inspiring in its own right.

This project:

- engages the students in active reading, writing and critical thinking about an autobiographical book
- allows them the opportunity to discuss with the author the task of writing. Because of the nature of the book, Erik's story of overcoming a handicap and fulfilling goals, the students will be inspired to transfer these lessons to their own lives. The books purchased through this endeavor would become property of Mountain Pointe High School and will be read by future classes.

EVIT Registration

EVIT is the regional vocational/technological high school for Tempe Union and all other East Valley communities. Over 1000 students attend EVIT half the school day and the other half at their home high school. Buses are provided for both morning and afternoon sessions. Free night school and summer school are also available however no transportation is provided. Students earn 3 credits per year which apply to the practical arts and elective requirements for graduation.

Why should your son or daughter attend EVIT?

1. EVIT graduates leave high school with well-developed, job specific skills and potentially earning salaries that are generally \$6-10 per hour.
2. Lack of financial resources is often the primary reason students do not complete a college program. The financial advantage obtained by attending EVIT (see reason number 1) can help students pay for further technical training or college.
3. EVIT is involved in articulation programs with local community colleges in which up to 12 semester hours of credit can be earned while attending selected EVIT classes. These programs enables students to complete a college program in less time and save on college costs. Other programs completely certify students which can save thousands of dollars in post-secondary training.
4. EVIT guarantees job placement upon completion of a program providing the student abides by regulations established by the school.

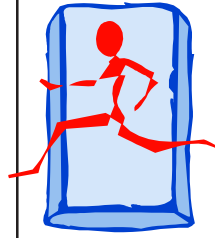

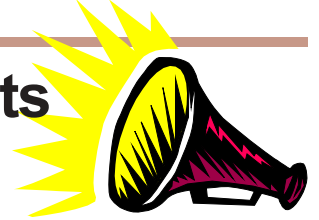

ATTENTION ATHLETES!

All athletes must have an equipment card before they can participate in a sport.

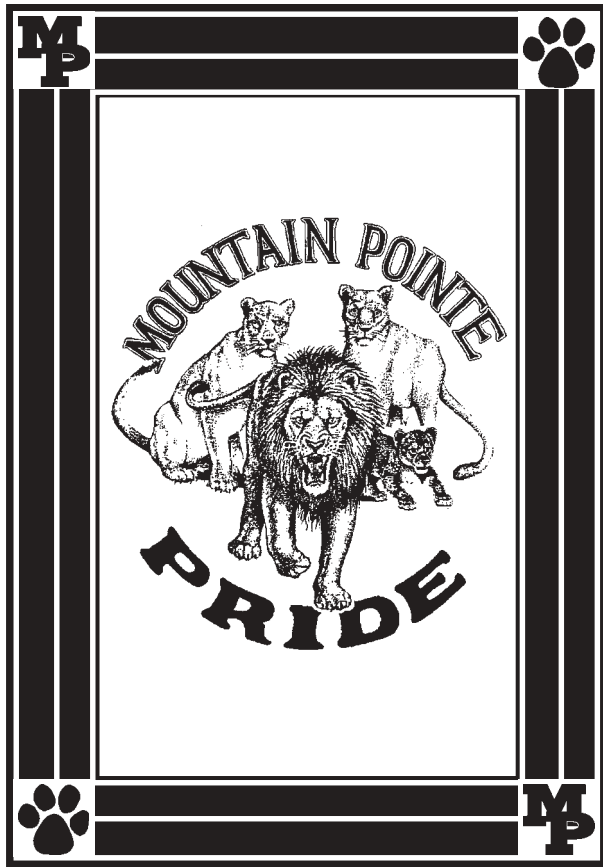

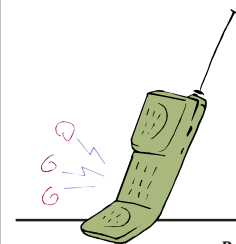
